### CAPE MAY COURTS.

The December term was held on Tuesday of last week, Justice Elinor presiding. As is usually the case in this law-abiding County, the whole public business of the Court was completed before Wednesday noon. The Grand Jury found two bills of indictment against Charles Kelly—one for stealing some old lead and copper from among the ruins of the Mt. Vernon Hotel, and the other for breaking jail, after having been arrested and committed on the charge. He pleaded guilty to the last indictment, and traversed the first. The jury found a verdict of "not guilty" upon the ground either that it had ceased to be considered a crime to steal from that company, or because they did not happen to own the property when the larceny was committed. Allen for State, Nixon for defendant. The only civil case was an issue in the Common Pleas, between Gifford Annelly, a doctor applying for the benefit of the insolvent laws, and Wm. S. Townsend, one of his creditors, who opposed his discharge on the ground of fraud in the disposal of his property. The whole day was consumed in the examination of witnesses and the argument of Counsel, and much outside interest was manifested in the case.

### New Mail Arrangement.

It has been customary for many years past to have but one mail carried by the old Mail Line of Stages between Philadelphia and this place, consequently it was necessary to have the whole number of packages "go over" at each Post Office along the route, whether there was anything to be "changed" or not. The passengers in the stage were compelled to wait at each post office until all the contents were overhauled. This arrangement has lately been done away with, and those who travel in this line will not be detained on the road as heretofore, as there is now a way mail and through mail. The through mail is generally well filled and requires no changing at the numerous Post Offices on the route. The way mail is changed at every Post Office, its contents are meagre, and but little time is spent in changing it; by this means the stage-drivers are enabled to make better time and more to the satisfaction of the passengers than was the old arrangement. It was through the persevering efforts of Mr. Pancoast, the enterprising Stage proprietor on this line, that such a desirable change was brought about, for which he deserves the thanks of the travelling community.

### TERRIBLE CASE OF LYNCHING.

A black man in Manchester, Ohio, broke into the house of a Mr. Morris, and committed an outrage upon Mrs. Morris, who, it is said, broke her own jaw in biting the negro. Her screams notwithstanding had attracted assistance, and the negro's wounds soon led to his detection, which excited intense indignation, in connection with two other outrages of a similar nature before attributed to him. He was found in bed with his face badly scratched and bleeding, just as described by his victim. The excited crowd took him forth with before day, to an island in the Ohio river just above the town, where they hung him up to a tree, but the rope breaking he revived. He then acknowledged the infernal deed, and would have been hung up again but for the interposition of some of the less excited in the crowd, whose counsel prevailed, and the negro was accordingly taken to West Union, lodged in jail, and chained to prevent his escape. During Monday night Mr. Morris reached home from Cincinnati. On Tuesday morning a crowd of men, with John Dougherty, brother of Mrs. Morris, at their head, left Manchester for the county seat, where they broke open the jail, bursting the lock with hammers and axes. On reaching the place where the negro was, Dougherty with one blow from his axe broke his chain, and then raised the axe to cleave the negro's skull, but the arm of the infuriated man was caught, and the negro saved for a different death. He was taken again to the island, and hung upon the limb of a tree some 22 feet high. On his way from jail, and while under his gallows, the negro cursed and swore terribly, and vowed if he should get off alive he would kill Mrs. Morris at sight.

### Who are not Citizens of the United States.

By a recent decision of Mr. Morry, colored persons are held not to be citizens under the Constitution of the United States. But this does not preclude them from being citizens of any particular State. Such citizens, however, are not entitled to the privilege, including the right of suffrage. Some of the States have also invested foreigners with other marks of citizenship. But these States have no effect to make such colored persons, or such immigrants citizens of the United States. Such foreigners can only become citizens by complying with the laws of naturalization, while colored persons, being held not to be within the purview of the Constitution, which commences with the phrase, "We, the people of the United States," cannot become citizens by any process whatever. They are "not people of the United States" in the sense of the Constitution.

### Relics from Nineweh.

The Congregationalists mention that the Barque David Webster, which arrived at Boston last week, from Bayonet, is reported to have as part of her cargo 51 cases of marble. These are probably the Assyrian slabs which are designed for two or three of the New England colleges, and which had been waiting at Bayonet nearly a year for a Boston vessel. Much curiosity will be felt to see these relics of antiquity, and it is to be hoped that they have sustained no injury in their long journey, and will reach their destination in safety.
