LOSSES ON THE MISSISSIPPI.

FUNERAL OF COL FRANCIS LEE.

The following just tribute we find in the St. Louis Republican, of the 24th ult. Col. Lee was a brother of the late Hon. Thomas Lee, of this county.

The honors of a military burial were yesterday paid the remains of Col. Francis Lee, of the 2d Regiment of Infantry, who died in St. Louis on the evening of the 19th inst.

The distinguished deceased was born in Pennsylvania, April 13th, 1802, and was consequently in his 37th year, when he died. At the age of 16 he entered the Military Academy at West Point as a cadet, and four years afterwards received his commission as 2d Lieutenant of the Seventh Infantry. Two years later he was promoted a grade higher and became First Lieutenant. In February, 1847, he attained the rank of Major of the Fourth Infantry, in which regiment he was in command during the entire war with Mexico.
