LAWS OF NEW JERSEY.

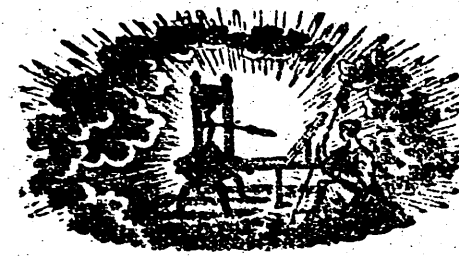
An act relative to the Main street in the town of
Greenwich, in the county of Cumberland.
Whereas, in the original location of the town
of Greenwich, in the county of Cumberland, Thomas
Chalkley laid out an addition to the town, one hun-
dred feet in width; and whereas, the precise loca-
tion of said street or road has been lost, in con-
sequence of which, the public has no adequate
means of protection against the encroachments
of the land owners adjoining said street; and
whereas, the inhabitants of said township, at a
last annual meeting, appointed Samuel G. Fithian,
John E. Keen, and Reuben B. Fithian, Requi-
res, a committee to apply to the Legisla-
ture of New Jersey for an act appointing three
commissioners to locate the said street, and the con-
sideration of the same, and to report thereon to the
Assembly of the State of New Jersey, that Bel-
ford M. Bonham, David Tomlin, and Erourin
Fithian, be, and they are hereby appointed com-
missioners to ascertain the location of said street,
and to lay out the same by courses and distan-
ces, and in case the said location and courses dis-
tances cannot be found, to lay out the same by
courses and distances, beginning at Cohansy creek
and laying the same to the late residence of Chas.
B. Fithian, deceased, and thence to the house of
John Tyler's house not less than
eighty-five feet in width; thence to Samuel Mul-
der's stone house not less than eighty feet in
width; thence to Pine Mount not less than
four rods in width; and thence to the
county line.

1. Be it enacted, That the said com-
missioners shall cause the street so laid out to be
marked as proper distances in a map or plat,
and shall return the same, with a map or plat
of the same, with the courses and distan-
ces, to the clerk of the court of common pleas of
the county of Cumberland, who is hereby ap-
pointed to receive the same, and to cause the same
to be recorded in the office of the Secretary of
the county of Cumberland, from the time of
recording the same as aforesaid, shall be a
public highway, and as such, to be repaired and
kept in good order.

2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take
effect immediately.
