I was recently informed by a wood-cutter, that the owners of wood usually require them to cut it three feet, eight inches, and three feet, ten inches in length.

The man who requires his wood to be cut three feet, ten inches in length, defrauds the consumer of one twenty-fourth part of a cord of wood; and if it is but three feet, eight inches, he is defrauded of one twelfth part of a cord.
