GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE.

The valdictory of Governor John Parker to the Senate and Assembly of the State of New Jersey has just been delivered, and is, taken together, a fair and moderate document, reflecting credit upon the Executive officer who is so soon to vacate the chair of office.
