THE ELECTIONS.

The elections in Bridgeton and so far as we can learn in the regions round about our Jordan passed off with a quietude which speaks well for the people, but which was sadly lamented by the different candidates for offices in the gift of the people.

In the eleven other states where elections were held, the results conformed to the general status of the public mind, although the general status of things is not materially changed.

In New York the Democratic candidate for Governor (Hoffman) received the unexpected large majority of 46,325, but the State elects for the Republican, by 10,000; a close contest in such a mass of voters as belong to that State.

Delaware Democratic by about 500 majority; she sends one member to Congress, rejecting the former incumbent.

Massachusetts gives 70,000 Republican majority and elects her entire Congressional delegation to the Republican.

Wisconsin gives a Republican majority of 20,000 in eight years. Four Congressmen and four of their five Congressmen are elected to the Republican.

Missouri sends but few returns as yet, but the indications are of Republican success.

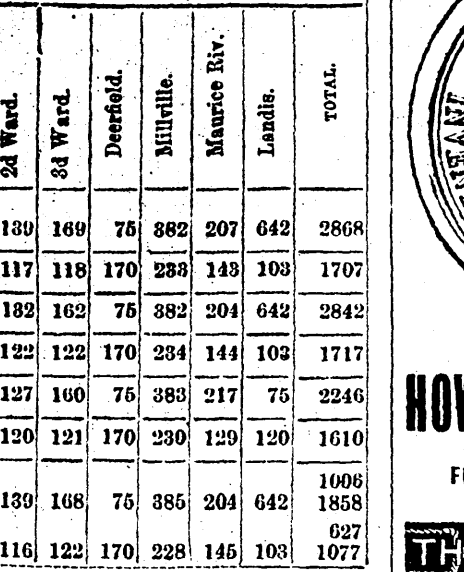
